

1.Elevate



Elevate was a fun-filled two-day event where we conducted 4 sub-events namely Group Story, Situation-Based Thinking, CatchPhrase, and Shark Tank. The participants were eliminated based on their scores in each event and at the end, the top two teams were declared the winners and runners. For the sub-event Shark Tank, members of the Rotaract District 3190 were invited as judges. Overall, after this session, positive feedback was received from participants and the judges.

Outcome: The event helped the participants to develop professional skills like critical thinking, pitching ideas, team work, etc. This event showed the participants how working together can bring in various different thought processes together and which can eventually lead to better ideas and executions.

2.BLOOD DONATION CAMP(BDC) (FIRST)



(Conducted two times in a single year)

Blood Donation Camp was conducted in collaboration with Rotary Bangalore South and Rotaract t Club of Bangalore after 3 years and it saw great success through the participation of a huge number of volunteers, who had the motive to serve the society. With the ideology to meet the growing need of Blood units, the event was organized in RVCE Campus on 9th of September with the help of 6 Blood Banks. All the volunteers assembled at the venue at 8:30 am and the camp started at 9:00 am at Biotech Quadrangle and Bus Shed, RVCE. In 9 hours of time, we collected 770 units of blood. The donors included rotractors, rotarians, students, teachers and common people who helped us in collecting blood to save lives.

Outcome: In the first edition of the BDC around 750+ units of blood was collected with the active and enthusiastic participation of the students from all the batches. Apart from students even faculty members and non-teaching staff actively donated blood. With the strong support of Rotary

Bangalore South, out parent rotary club, the BDC was a grand success and highlights our commitment towards the society.

3.Naivedyam



The Rotaract club of RVCE organized another Mega Event Naivedyam, an International Services event, on 16th of October on the occasion of International Food Day. We pledged to feed 400 hungry people across the Bangalore city through this event. To reach the same goal we had 8 Rotaract clubs, which include clubs from in and outside of the district, collaborating for this event. Board members and volunteers went to the slum opposite to Police station Koramangala Bangalore to distribute the food to the needy. Likewise, clubs from Coimbatore and Mumbai also distributed the food. With the overwhelming support of all the clubs and the volunteers, we were able to feed 492 people in total.

4.Rush Hours 3.0



A community service project which went on for 5 days and included a pre-event task to build interest among the participants followed by 8 main tasks. The participants run for their positions as each task led to the elimination of a certain number of teams; with 200+ participants; participating actively, followed by regular updates through the event dashboard and leader board. The event was a huge success with the participants contributing to society along with having fun in this process. The top 5 teams were rewarded with OTT subscriptions and other prizes.

Outcome: A 5-day community service project featured a pre-event task and 8 main tasks, engaging over 200 active participants. Participants competed for positions, with eliminations occurring after each task. Regular updates were provided through an event dashboard and leaderboard. The event was highly successful, blending societal contributions with enjoyment. The top 5 teams were rewarded with OTT subscriptions and other prizes.

5.Fast-Trek




6.Sampravaha (Club Installation)



7.Blood Donation Camp 2023(BDC) (SECOND)



11. Paper Drive



With an overwhelming support of 500+ volunteers, the students collected more than 7 tonnes of newspapers in just over 9 hours! The volunteers, registered for the event, assembled at Kriyakalpa, RVCE at 8:00 AM. Volunteers were taken to different localities of Bangalore by buses to collect all sorts of papers. The incentive behind this was to raise funds by selling the collected old newspapers, books, magazines, waste papers etc. to paper vendors, and donating the same amount for the welfare of the Nele Narendra Foundation.

Outcome: The Paper Drive initiative garnered significant support, with volunteers collecting 7 tonnes of old newspapers across 7 different localities of Bengaluru within 9 hours. 1. Rupantara


The webinar session was conducted as a part of MHHM's Rupantara initiative to spread basic knowledge about menstruation and raise awareness. The session for RVCE took place on Monday, 12th of July 2021 from 4:30pm to 6pm. The session was handled by members of the Rupantara team. The main speaker for the session was Rtr. Ramya Aswathnarayana who is currently the ZRR of Rotaract District 3190 2021-22. The webinar started off with talking about the changes that occur during puberty, went on to discuss the advantages and disadvantages of different sanitary products that are used, the impacts they have health and how they affect the environment. The meeting finally concluded with a Q&A session.

Outcome- The positive outcome of the webinar session conducted as part of MHHM's Rupantara initiative is increased awareness and knowledge about menstruation among the participants, particularly students at RVCE. This knowledge empowers individuals to make informed choices about menstrual hygiene products, understand the impacts on health and the environment, and contribute to breaking the stigma surrounding menstruation. Additionally, the Q&A session likely provided an opportunity for clarification and further education, fostering a supportive and inclusive environment for discussing menstruation-related topics.




impact they can make in the lives of others and inspiring a sense of empathy and social responsibility.






Fig - Quiz leaderboard and winners

3.Plantation Drive

On the 15th of September, the club sent wishes to its budding engineers as well as urging the fellow members to contribute to society to promote sustainable development. Members were requested to plant saplings in their nearby surroundings and tag the social media handle of the club. As a result, 221 saplings were planted by 184 participants. 4. Project Sahakarita

Cognizant provided more than 12500 computers to be distributed across institutions in Karnataka. The project 'Sahakarita' started as an MoU signed between Karnataka Government, Rotary International District – 3190, and Cognizant. Rotaract Club of RVCE was to coordinate the installation, testing, packaging, and transporting of the PCs and their components donated by Cognizant. Volunteers from the Rotaract Club of RVCE assembled at Government Arts College from 12th March 2021 to assemble the computer setup. What followed was a continuous monthlong process of providing the product to the various colleges across the city. Rotaractors assembled and completed the installation, sorting, and packaging of the setup with all required hardware like the mouse, keyboard, desktop, and software like Microsoft Office with license certification. They were tasked with proper completion while simultaneously following all safety protocols. To ensure efficiency and nullify mistakes, volunteers were provided with mandatory training. The output sprang to more than 500 Computers a day ready to be dispatched. Each of the systems was tested before sending to logistics and their barcode was scanned for proper documentation.

Outcome: Cognizant donated 12,500+ computers for Karnataka institutions via the 'Sahakarita' project. The Rotaract Club of RVCE coordinated assembly, testing, and distribution, achieving over 500 computers assembled daily. Volunteers ensured each setup included hardware and software, adhering to safety protocols. Mandatory training ensured efficiency and accuracy, resulting in meticulous documentation for proper distribution.

5. Project Awaaz

In this time where education has been a huge matter of concern, Rotaract Club of RVCE came up with a new initiative "Project Awaaz". Under this project, over 100 + Educational audio books were recorded in three languages English, Hindi and Kannada. A website was also created for easy accessibility of the content, where the recordings of all the stories were made accessible to NGOs. A total of 100 recordings were collected, out of which 24 were of Kannada, 32 of Hindi and 44 of English. The club donated these recordings to 13 NGOs at no cost for the education of their students.

Outcome:: Rotaract Club of RVCE initiated "Project Awaaz," recording over 100 educational audiobooks in English, Hindi, and Kannada. A user-friendly website was developed for NGO accessibility. A total of 100 recordings were donated to 13 NGOs, comprising 24 Kannada, 32 Hindi, and 44 English audiobooks, facilitating free education for their students.



6. Speaktravaganza 2.0

The second edition of Speaktravaganza had a crowd engagement of more than 271 students with age groups ranging from 15 to 23, making it the world's largest online communication festival. The events ranged from debating to entrepreneurship events, from thoughtful contents like sharing writeups, poems to lighthearted meme creation. It was a huge success with 11 minievents with participants from 5 countries and 20 different cities. Rotaract club of RVCE collaborated with team Enunciate as knowledge partner, where we provided supported for knowledge, experience, resources and outreach as well as assisted in events.

Outcome: Speaktravaganza's second edition, the world's largest online communication festival, attracted over 271 students aged 15 to 23. The event featured 11 mini-events, including debates, entrepreneurship activities, and creative content creation, with participants from 5 countries and 20 cities. The Rotaract Club of RVCE partnered with Enunciate, providing support as a knowledge partner, ensuring the event's success.

bring in various different thought processes together and which can eventually lead to better ideas and executions.




Fig - Event being conducted online

Outcome: The students were exposed to different career options, with their pros and cons, future job profile, expected work was presented to the students and the session also emphasized on the fact that in any stream to excel, one should be interested, dedicated and hardworking. The

importance of goal setting and achieving was also addressed among the students. The meeting recordings reached 2000+ students.

9. Stayfree of the Whisper



Dr. Bharti Sahu an associate professor at NSCB Government Hospital, Jabalpur, and Dr. Amita Saxena from Marble City Hospital, Jabalpur addressed the muchhushed topic, periods experienced by females. They emphasized the importance which needs to be given to menstrual hygiene, gave deeper insight from their perspective on the first experience and the emotional, physical, and mental reaction to it. The biological aspect of the phenomena was beautifully explained. The physical impact such as PMS and other painful trauma was also spoken about. Then the webinar channelized in the direction of ways of handling and reducing the pain through a healthy diet and lifestyle, exercise and meditation. Precautionary measures that can be taken for hygiene during this phase was brought in light. The event also busted some common myths and successfully broke the taboo and stigma in the most effective way. This webinar was conducted in collaboration with 9 other clubs.

Outcome: Dr. Bharti Sahu and Dr. Amita Saxena addressed menstruation, emphasizing hygiene and providing insights on physical and emotional aspects. They discussed managing pain through lifestyle changes and broke taboos. Collaborating with 9 clubs, the webinar raised awareness and fostered open dialogue.



1.Uptown Junk:



Project description: The event focused on involving the students of our college in a competition wherein they had to make 'best out of waste'. It was conducted on 12/09/2019. We are grateful to the dear participants of "Uptown Junk", where they literally stood up to the fact that, "One's man garbage is another man's treasure!" Witnessing a participation 280+ Rotaractors as participants, it was indeed a blissful experience to see students going great lengths to get the model to fruition. The event began with a Fortune Quest wherein the participants have to solve a set of clues laid out in college campus and collect virtual Rota-Money from the clue-answer site, with which they can buy waste and prepare their models. The college amphitheatre was set up like a small workshop wherein the students got a chance to bring out the true engineer in them. The top 3 teams with most creative model was awarded prizes. The models were evaluated on the basis of four factors namely, Ideation, Creation, Presentation and Utility.

Outcome: The "Uptown Junk" competition engaged over 280 Rotaractors in creating innovative models from waste materials. Participants embarked on a Fortune Quest to collect virtual Rota-Money for purchasing waste materials. With the college amphitheater transformed into a workshop, students showcased their engineering skills. The top 3 teams with the most creative models were awarded prizes, evaluated based on Ideation, Creation, Presentation, and Utility.



1. **Mega Trek V4.0:**



Project description: The event focused on a Trek to Huthri Betta on 29/09/2019, which was organized by Rotaract Club of Banashankari. The social cause behind the project was to provide heart surgeries and treatment to the underprivileged children. Along with that it also aimed at bringing people from all over the district together to increase friendship and fellowship. 304 participants from RaC RVCE assembled in the college at 6:30 AM, and boarded the bus to Trek Location with great enthusiasm. There, safety instructions were given to all along with basic information of the event. Mega trek V4.0 was a great success as over 2000 rotaractors all across Bangalore assembled near the scenic hills of Huthri Betta and embarked on what would be a very memorable

Outcome: The Mega Trek V4.0 by Rotaract Club of Banashankari aimed to support heart surgeries for underprivileged children while fostering fellowship. With 304 participants from RaC RVCE, the trek began at 6:30 AM. Safety instructions were provided before boarding the bus. Over 2000 Rotaractors from Bangalore joined near Huthri Betta for the memorable journey, with breakfast and lunch organized at the trek location.

2. Free Eye-Check Up Camp:



Project description: Due to many reasons, there is a neglection in society to get one's eyes tested, may it be financial or a general disregard. For this we organized a Free Eye Check-Up Camp on 22nd October' 2019 that aimed at providing the students, faculty and non-teaching staff

of our college and their families, an opportunity to get their eyes tested free of cost within campus. The event was done in association with ASCE Student Chapter RVCE and Karthik Nethralaya Hospital from where a dedicated team of doctors, total 4, had come to do the check-up. They addressed each patient with utmost care and provided with prescription for their respective case. More than 350 people showed up in the whole day and got their eyes tested for vision and any other anomaly related to eyes.

Outcome: A Free Eye Check-Up Camp held on October 22nd, 2019, addressed societal neglect towards eye testing. In collaboration with ASCE Student Chapter RVCE and Karthik Nethralaya Hospital, four dedicated doctors provided free examinations to over 350 attendees within the college campus. The event promoted eye health awareness and accessibility to essential medical services.



Eye Checkup being done


3. **Donation towards PM CARES:**

2. Akshara 3.0

All kids need a little help, a little hope and somebody who believes in them. With this thought in mind and zeal to give students something that we as students always craved in education, we organized skill development sessions in 11 schools in the locality of RR Nagar and Kengeri, Bangalore. The sessions were aimed for underprivileged students who are from a financially modest background and are in dire need of Quality Education. The sessions consisted of a designed syllabus of three modules namely, Mathematics, Spoken English, Soft Skills, 1 hour for each module. The students of various schools gave a heatening feedback, in person and on paper feedback forms to all 'teachers' for the day. Volunteers also had a memorable experience of stepping into the shoes of their teachers for one day. Volunteers were provided with refreshments after their sessions. Session helped the students in understanding concepts that were there for their class/standard.

Outcome: Akshara 3.0 successfully conducted skill development sessions in 11 schools within RR Nagar and Kengeri, Bangalore, benefiting underprivileged students. Modules in Mathematics, Spoken English, and Soft Skills were designed to empower students from financially modest backgrounds. Positive feedback from both students and volunteers highlighted the impact of the sessions, fostering a supportive learning environment and facilitating meaningful connections between volunteers and students.




Fig - Volunteers and students

1. Paper Drive



To aid and abet an orphanage, we organized a Paper drive wherein enthusiastic volunteers from college collected old newspapers in various areas of Bengaluru. The volunteers, registered for the event, assembled at Kriyakalpa, RVCE at 8:00 AM. Volunteers were taken to over 7 different localities of Bangalore by buses to collect old newspaper. The incentive behind this was to raise funds from the collected newspaper by selling it to paper vendors, and donating the same amount for the welfare of an Orphanage. With tenacious efforts and enthusiasm of all volunteers who participated in this step towards amelioration, we were able to collect 15.52 Tonnes of paper in just 10 Hours.

Outcome: The Paper Drive initiative garnered significant support, with volunteers collecting 15.52 tonnes of old newspapers across 7 different localities of Bengaluru within 10 hours. Proceeds from selling the collected paper were directed towards aiding an orphanage, symbolizing a collective effort towards social welfare and community empowerment.





With this ideology and to meet the growing need of Blood units across hospitals in Bengaluru, a Blood Donation Camp was organized in RVCE Campus on 1st of March, with help of 14 Blood Banks and corresponding team of Doctors. Preparation for camp included decorating the entire college with Promotional Production design artifacts. Camp began at 9:00 AM in the CRC Building and within a 7 hours duration, we collected 1109 units of Blood. 

4. Uptown Junk

5. R-Evolution : Dasham

A total of 182 teams (2 members per team) registered for the event. Two guests had arrived on the day of event from RaC DYPVP to witness the event, and stayed with us for 2 days. The quiz was a general aptitude test. The event started with collaring of the President by the Secretary of RaC RVCE, followed by Lightening of lamp by the dignitaries that included Principal, Dr. KN Subramanya and Faculty Dr. Shanmukha Nagaraj. The quiz duration was 30 minutes. After evaluation, winning teams were honoured on the stage. The two qualifying teams will be going to DY Patil College in Pune for competing further in International Rounds of R-Evolution Dasham, with teams all around the globe.

Outcome: Dasham prelims, hosted by RaC RVCE in collaboration with RaC DYPVP, Pune, saw participation from 182 teams, showcasing the enthusiasm of Rotaractors. The event featured a general aptitude quiz, witnessing the collaring of the President and lamp lighting by esteemed dignitaries. Winning teams earned the opportunity to compete internationally at DY Patil College in Pune, highlighting the event's success in fostering global engagement and intellectual exchange among Rotaract clubs worldwide.
