

# A HELPING HAND FOR KERALA AND KODAGU FLOOD VICTIMS






### 20) Utsarga Marathon 2021

The importance of food, the impacts of food waste, the reasons for the food waste, and about undernutrition all were discussed.


In the second week, the action plan to reduce the food wastage is explained. The many ways to avoid food wastage was conveyed to the volunteers.


#### Description-

- 5. Stress and Time Management

Life skill aims to empower students to deal effectively with the demands of everyday life by improving self-regulation, making informed decisions, and building supportive social relationships. These life skills include problem solving, critical thinking, communication skills, decision- making, creative thinking, interpersonal relationship skills, self awareness building skills, empathy and coping with stress skills.

Life skills activity was Mainly focussed on empathy, communication skill development, decision making, leadership quality, stress and emotion management and time management as well. Firstly, Students were divided into different batches in order to their branches. Then, half of the batch attended a presentation session which included some basic information about communication skill development, how to enhance leadership quality in one, how to deal with stress, and how to manage time in the daily routine. So, This was basically a theory session where everything was explained theoretically in a slot. And the other half of the batch were involved in practical activities related to the same subject in that slot. These activities included, firstly, to know about how different people have different Communication perspectives. And the second activity was about self awareness and emotions. Description-

The Government of India has been proactive in vaccinating its population masses through National COVID Vaccination Program starting with the Health-Care workers and expanded with time to include vaccination of Front-line workers, citizens above 60 years, citizens above 45 years and eventually for citizens above 18 years.

With COVID cases spiking every day, vaccination has become the utmost priority for most of the people. With this in mind, NSS RVCE conducted a Vaccination Drive on 11th of August 2022 in collaboration with Kengeri Primary Health Centre.

Phase 1 of the Vaccination Drive:





#### Introduction:

Blood Donation Camp was organised by RVCE to increase the awareness about regular non-remunerated voluntary blood donations and ensure that blood or its components are easily available, affordable, accessible and safe. According to data provided by the Union Ministry of Health, India needs over 1.5 billion units of blood each year. In every two seconds, a patient in India needs blood and one out of every three people will need blood in their lifetime. With this in mind, NSS RVCE along with Rotaract club of RVCE and NCC RVCE organised a Blood Donation Drive on 9th September, 2022. Despite the technological advancements, there remains no alternative to blood and one unit of blood can save as many as three lives.

#### Pre-preparation for the drive:

The entire campus was transformed into a blood donation theme in order to draw a huge number of donors. Since September 5th, all volunteers have contributed to the PD work and camp publicity by decorating the campus. Additionally, the necessary packaging for refreshments was made. Posters were stuck all around the campus to remove the myths surrounding blood donation thus, encouraging more people to participate in the drive.

#### On the day of the drive:

The volunteers from NSS, NCC and Rotaract clubs assembled at 7:00 A.M in the morning where they were addressed by Major Ragavendra regarding the drive. Then, all the volunteers got to work making the necessary preparations and packing up all the refreshments. The blood donation camp was conducted in collaboration with Rotary Bangalore South-Red Cross, Lions Club, Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology and Department of Haematology and Blood transfusion of Victoria hospital.

The drive began at 9:00 A.M and the donors were asked to register first. Then they were given a coupon, instructing them to proceed further. The donors were asked to fill a form stating their personal details like name, occupation, e-mail, phone number, preexisting health condition if any. Then the donors' blood pressure, weight and their overall health condition was examined by the doctor. Next, the haemoglobin level of the donor was checked to above 12.5 using HB true machine or by adding copper sulphate on the drop blood on a glass slide. If all the prerequisites were met, the donor's blood was drawn and collected in a 100ml Transfer Bag and then being sent to a blood bank. The donors were then offered refreshments and instructed to relax right away. 721 donors, including faculty, students, and non-teaching staff, actively participated in the drive.

The shelf life of donated blood is 35 to 42 days. The collected blood will be processed into components such as plasma, red blood cells and platelets. Frozen plasma could be used up to a year, while red blood cells can be used for up to 35 to 42 days and platelets need to be used within 5 days. The drive came to an end at 6:00 P.M in the evening with over 750+units of blood being collected and a valedictory function was held later by Rotary club where they addressed all the volunteers about the significance of blood donation campaign.

Dr.M Lokeshwari was honoured for excellent coordination between the charitable organisations and the college and the success of the blood donation drive.

#### **Description:**



To create awareness of the importance of freshwater and to prevent lake and river extinction due to modern industrial developments.





#### Introduction:




#### **Outcomes:**


After that, all the volunteers had little conversations about the camp. Then around 9 pm, everyone had their dinner, and by 10:30 pm everyone got back to sleep.

#### Description:





#### Description of the camp:




The breakfast was served at MMFG college at 10a.m with the help of the dignitaries at Chitradurga.

A feedback session was conducted initially for the Programme Officers from the other states followed by the volunteers.







### PREREQUISITES FOR THE SURVEY

### SURVEY APP TRAINING

The village survey camp to be conducted needs to be completed by using the app Amrutha Samudaya by Center of e-Governance. This app has unique features and linked to data basis. The main aim of this survey is to digitalized the basic records like Aadhaar data, ration card data, health cards, number of members in the family and so on. App opens with a login system and has various interfaces hence it is very much important to know the how to access different features of the app. Survey consists of various types, there will be many different cases of different families. To complete the survey the app has various in-built features that need to be known. Hence the survey app training becomes a mandatory requirement before the survey.

The state NSS unit has conducted many hands-on training sessions offline/online on how to use the Amrutha Samudaya app for successful conduction of the survey. Four of our volunteers Nagaraj, Abhay Akshay, Manoj and Vivek successfully attended the training sessions provided by the state unit.

In this training session, we learnt how to create a surveyor account. How to distribute the villages for each surveyor with allotting the door numbers to them and how to fill the data in the app and what are all the procedure.

So, two of our volunteers Nagaraj and Abhay Akshay created the surveyor accounts of all 100 volunteers by fetching their Aadhar details and using the user id of the NSS PO.




Fig. Surveyor account creation (Amrutha Samudaya Website)




Fig. Village Assigning (Amrutha Samudaya Website)




Fig. Village Assigning to surveyor with door number (Amrutha Samudaya Website)

### ALLOATE THE DOOR NUMBER & VILLAGES TO EACH SURVEYOR

After successful creation of surveyor account, it was very important to allocate them the villages and door numbers of the villagers. According to which the survey has to be completed.

After taking some previous raw data and analysing the number of households in each village, we allotted the 25 door numbers to each surveyor sequentially.

### MAKE THE VOLUNTEER WHO UNDERTOOK THE TRAINING AS TEAM HEADS

Since all the volunteers were new to the concept of survey it is very important to lead them in this important task of the survey. As many surveyors had various doubts regarding survey, area allocations, survey app working, which needed to be efficiently handled and solved by a trained person. Since four of our volunteers had already received the training of the survey app, they took the task of leading the volunteers in different villages. All the trained volunteers were allotted to different for different villages to take leas of the surveyors and carry out the survey task efficiently.

## GIVE TRAINING SESSIONS TO ALL THE VOLUNTEERS ON DOWNLOADING THE APP, LOGIN, WORKING OF THE APP AND VARIOUS TUTORIALS

The whole survey task depends on the Amrutha Samudaya app all our volunteers had zero knowledge about the working of app how to login, how to access various feature's and how to add data and how to remove data how to adds picture's how to save the data and finally how to upload the data to cloud. This survey work needed to be done with extreme care and precision. Since after uploading we can't change the data so many training sessions needed to be provided to volunteers on all these aspects in very depth manner these training sessions were conducted by our trained volunteers on the form of video presentations, live presentations doubt sessions and seminars. Many video tutorials were provided to the volunteers in order to get to know about the working of the app.





### STEPS FOR HOW TO LOGIN & UPLOAD DATA

### STEP 1) LOGIN

- Enter a Correct Adhar name and Adhar number which was already given in creation of account.

NOTE: As there is a space in between the name in Adhar and while filling you get to know there is no space but in this we have to fill without spaces)

To do all this we need the cooperation of the families their help in providing with us the basic data Aadhar number ration never and their patience in answering few of our yes or no questions. This was really a very necessity task to be performed one advantage in this concern related to Aroodi GP was our NSS unit had conducted the village camp in the 5 villages 8 months ago so our volunteers had developed a good sense of bond and faith with these villages. So, survey work in these villages was a bit easier task but the villages of Bannerughatta GP were a totally new to our volunteers so it was very important to these people before the beginning of survey. Hence, we collected a contacts of various Asha workers, anganwadi teachers, gram panchayat members of these villages and took their help for the successful conduction of the survey.






Fig. Ethical Values session by Dr. R. Pardhasaradhi





- As usual cultural performance had great and we gave a team performance of Kamsale, a Folk Art












Fig. 300 Years of Dutch Building




Fig. Dr Eda Samuel Reddy by started program by lightning the lamp

- Huli Vesha is performed to pay tribute to Goddess Durga, whose official animal is tiger. Goddess Durga is often known for her aggressive stance, capable of keeping evil forces away from her devotees.
- Huli Vesha is seen in all coastal Karnataka towns, such as Mangaluru, Udupi, Kundapura, Moodubidiri, Karkala and so on.
- While the dance is called a tiger dance, the characters also themselves painted with the motif of a leopards or a cheetah. Each person will be wearing just a knicker which usually has a tiger skin motif. The rest of his bare body and face is painted with various designs that denote tigers, cheetahs and leopards. A mask made of fake fur and sometimes a tail is worn to complete the ensemble.


